Total Population: According to the final results of the General Population and Housing Census carried out in 2019 (RGPH 2019), the population of Burkina Faso is estimated at 20,505,155 inhabitants comprising 9,900,847 men and 10,604,308 women.	
Demographic Structure: From 2006 to 2019, Burkina Faso's population increased from 14,017,262 to 20,505,155. According to demographic projections for 2020-2035, the population is estimated to reach 22,868,915 in 2023, comprising 11,060,622 men and 11,808,293 women. The vast majority of Burkina Faso's population, 73.86%, resides in rural areas, compared to 26.14% in urban areas. Women represent more than half of the population, at 51.8% and 51.7% respectively.	
Number of Refugees and Immigrants (if any): No refugees, but thousands of forcibly displaced people (FDP) who have been victims of terrorism for a decade.	
National Income:	Population Rate Living Below the Poverty Line:

	Based on the absolute monetary poverty threshold, the incidence of poverty, which represents the proportion of poor people in the population at the national level, is 43.2%, with a poverty depth of 13% and a severity of 5.4%.
Literacy Rate: From 1994 to 2018, the literacy rate increased from 18.9% to 39.3%, representing a rise of 20.4 percentage points. Furthermore, the literacy rate increased from 23.4% in rural areas to 64.0% in urban areas. The literacy rate for women is significantly lower than that for men (26.1% versus 44.3%) (EMC, 2014).

2.5. Project detail:

Short Description of Project:	OSEH ensures that your Aqeeqah (Aqiqah) is conducted where it is most needed globally, ensuring that the blessings reach maximum families. In Burkina Faso, the luxury of consuming meat is beyond the reach of many due to its high cost. The Aqeeqah Project ensures that these families get a rare chance to cook meat for their loved ones, bringing them joy and nourishment. OSEH staff distribute fresh meat packs to the most vulnerable globally, focusing on those grappling with food insecurity. For every Aqeeqah carried out, OSEH ensures transparency by providing donors with a comprehensive report. This includes images, the location of the distribution, and the number of beneficiaries. The present project consists in sacrificing 28 cows and redistributing the meat to the population, each beneficiary will have 4-5 kg; the vast majority is of whose beneficiaries will be forced displaced persons from the attacks of armed groups in the Sahel, North and Center North regions of Burkina Faso.
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	The animals will be purchased and transported to Ouagadougou where the slaughter will take place. They will be immolated; the skin removed then cut into small pieces, put in plastic bags and shared in the mass. All stages of the execution will be documented in images and transmitted to the partner, YETIM VAKFI Foundation.
Project Cause:	Although Burkina Faso is an agricultural country, the country regularly faces food difficulties. Rainfall is very often highlighted as the primary cause of food insufficiency, but this must be associated with poor tools for producers and above all a good agricultural policy in favor of poor farmers who often lack the minimum to cope with the nature. The involvement of 80% of the population has clearly not allowed the country to achieve food sufficiency, for a population which is at a 10% increase in the number of children aged 6 to 59 months (source: note of page No. 1). This food stress hits the regions most affected by insecurity the hardest; namely: The East, the north, the north central and the Sahel, which bring together nearly 80.1% of forced displaced persons (FDP). In these regions, 75% of households will not be able to cover food needs through their own production, compared to 52% nationally.
Project Goals:	The main objective is to provide beef to vulnerable people and especially people in forced displacement due to terrorism affecting the respective areas. Thus, the project aims to help people with food difficulties, and who lack regular access to sufficiently healthy and nutritious food for normal growth and development and an active and healthy life.

New regulations have been introduced to govern the interventions of humanitarian organizations, including the principle of protecting the dignity of vulnerable people. Specifically, the practice of taking photographs next to donations and lining up beneficiaries to receive food kits is perceived as degrading to human dignity and dehumanizing humanitarian action.

It is recommended to work closely with local authorities to ensure that humanitarian action complies with the guidelines of the public authorities in Burkina Faso.

- **PURCHASE:** Purchasing animals at the local market can take one to two weeks, as cattle are not readily available as they were in the past, because herders have had to migrate far to escape the fighting between Burkina Faso's defense forces and armed terrorist groups.
- **TRANSPORTATION:** This involves transporting the animals to the slaughter site.
- **SLAUGHTERING, SKINNING, AND BUTTERING:** The butchering process involves slaughtering the animals, removing the skin, and cutting them into pieces before packaging them in bags.
- **DISTRIBUTION:** Distribution of meat kits to beneficiaries.
- **REPORT CLOSING:** The administrative documents detailing the complete implementation of the project.

The Organization for Humanitarian Relief OSEH has acquired experience in the implementation of projects of this type. It has, for years, executed projects during the Qurban with a capacity of execution of more than 1746 cows in last year 2025; we believe that we are largely capable of carrying out the realization of a project of 05 oxen in good conditions in respecting the standards of hygiene, sanitation and the rights of beneficiaries.

We do not have internal audit, but the ministry of finance is being doing annually over all activities OSEH organization has been carrying out. It should be noted that since January 2022, the OSEH organization has opened a registration list of refugees who have arrived in Ouagadougou. In addition, in no time, the list grew to a thousand people; to date, nearly 5,000 people are still waiting for a gesture of help from the OSEH organization and its partners.

Therefore, this project is also a relief and an opportunity to help people who have placed their trust in OSEH and its partners.

The implementation of this project, like several other projects, is applied in accordance with the current texts of the OSEH organization's procedure manual approved by its board of directors.
